It is important for your child to continue their learning at home;

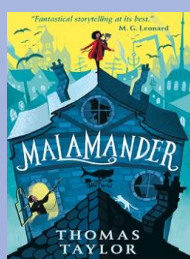
- **Reading:** Please encourage your children to read. Like last term, we will be checking the Reading Record books every Wednesday and would like to see at least 4 reads and signatures from parents or older relatives/siblings. The children will earn 1x house point for four reads and 2x house points for more than four. I'm really pleased with how much the children are reading – thank you!

### SATS

Year 6 children will complete SATS tests on the 9<sup>th</sup> (Grammar & spelling), 10<sup>th</sup> (Reading), 11<sup>th</sup> maths papers 1 & 2) and 12<sup>th</sup> May (maths paper 3). You do not need to prepare your children for this week other than make sure they get a good nights sleep each night and give them plenty of encouragement.

They are well prepared for this week and are currently spending some time each morning with Miss Cunningham recapping over certain questions in preparation for the tests. I'm really pleased with their positive attitude and at this stage just need lots of encouragement.



For **Guided Reading** we have started reading Malamander, which is a wonderfully exciting adventure story. This 40 chapter book will keep us busy all term!

In **RE** we will start learning about what religions teach us when life gets tough. Then after half term we will be learning about what Jesus was like and comparing him to a king.

During **science** the children will build on their prior learning of the topic Animals, including Humans. The children will learn about the changes that happen to humans as we get older.

In **geography** the children will find out about the UK's global trade links, investigating where everyday products come from and the journeys they take to our homes. This builds on work the children have done lower down the school looking at the geography of food. The children will also map out journeys taken by items, and research the pros and cons of buying local or imported goods. Linked closely to our geography topic **history** sees the children explore the question of why people go on a journey, and look at five different journeys in depth. The journeys span from the Tudor period to those undertaken today by refugees.

We have started exploring the life of Jackson Pollock in **art** and we will create our own abstract art throughout the term.

In **PSHE** this term the children will learn about safety online and possible online dangers. The children will also learn about what to do if faced with an emergency.
