PE days for this term are Tuesday and Friday.

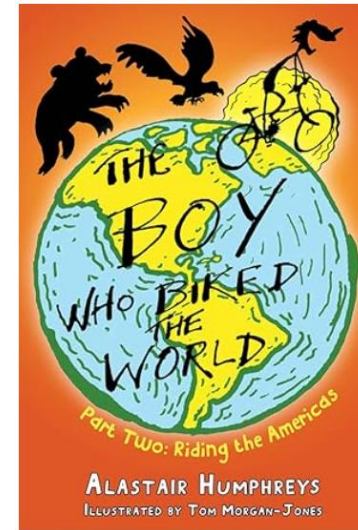
English

We will be starting with explanation texts and then the children will be writing adventure stories.

After half term, we will be learning to write persuasively and letter-writing and then building further on our playscript work from Year 3 and writing more plays.

Science

Our topics for this term are digestion and food and forces and magnets. To start with we will be looking at the human body and how it digests food.

History

The question we will be asking this term is 'How hard was it to invade and settle in Britain?' We will be learning about the invasion of the Anglo-Saxons and their impact on Britain.

Geography

The question we will be looking at this term will be 'Who lives in Antarctica?'. Understanding who lives there, what it's like to live there and the adventurers who have explored it,

French

Our French topics for this term are greetings and adjectives.

RE

In RE we will be looking at the questions 'What do Christians learn from the creation story?' and 'What is it like for someone to follow God?'

PE

This term we will be focusing on improving our understanding of invasion games through netball and handball. Will be exploring dance later in the term.

Music

To start the term, we are creating compositions based on animations with the theme of mountains. In the second half of the term we will be looking at rock and roll and be learning how to sing and dance in a rock and roll style.

Design and Technology and Art

This half term, the children will be looking at eating seasonally and where different fruits and vegetables are grown in DT.

In art, we will be discovering Light and Dark after half term, with a visit to York Art Gallery for inspiration at the beginning of November.
